



Andrew played electric guitar and gave us history lessons, introduced the numbers and explained who wrote them and who made them popular – names like Big Bill Broonzy and Etta James. Local jazz virtuoso, Martha Baartz, showed she can play the blues as well as anyone.

A wonderful night of perfect jazz music from a talented jazz quintet. Todd on trumpet played and sang ballads and jazz tunes to an appreciative audience. As usual, Wil treated us to a boogie-woogie solo.
