We even succeeded in attracting a significant number of new members; significant in the sense that they come from a younger age demographic, in a firm endorsement of the wisdom of expanding the music format to embrace blues as well as jazz. This new membership component is now represented on our Committee, in the person of Sami Fidock, who joins the returning members full of new ideas and youthful energy.

We have every expectation that the coming Club year will be every bit as successful as last year, but as ever we depend upon member loyalty on gig nights. We aim to make gigs self-financing, with door income covering the ever-increasing cost of bands, topped up by the all-important, and frequently crucial, raffle profits. The Club will only exist for as long as you turn up on gig nights, preferably with a few friends, and in return we offer the best in jazz and blues.

We're planning a great start to 2020, with January marking the welcome return of the distinctive vibraphone jazz and blues experience of 'Bags of Groove'. They're followed in February by 'The James Street Preachers', whose authentic sound was perfected at the feet of Blues legend Wylie Reed.

As for March – hold the front page! – we're in the process of inviting George Washingmachine to join us 'at the foot of the sugar mill', as he always puts it. So lots to look forward to,

and a happy and safe long holiday break to everyone.

After playing with bebop groups in the 1940s, he became the epitome of the Cool School in the 50s. Sorry, Milt Jackson will not be coming to Condong, but a very talented group of

Musicians will be entertaining you with a tribute to this great jazz artist. They will be playing Milt Jackson compositions and more. Although cool, they are still hot enough to swing. Bags of Groove musicians are Dave Kemp on vibraphone, Glen Shepherd on keyboard, Val Jones on double bass and Richie Seymour on drums. Adding the full sound of a tenor saxophone is special guest Catharina Kemp.



Kasdaglis and Matt Lye were fortunate enough to learn at the feet of the master, playing in Wylie Reed's backing band off and on for 15 years.

The James Street Preachers are on a mission to take the blues back to the street by playing homage to Blues Legend Wylie Reed. Key influences include Muddy Waters, Willy Dixon, Sonny Boy Williamson, Howling Wolf, Hound dog Taylor, Sonny Terry and Brownie McGhee. The duo began busking on James Street, Burleigh playing blues the way it was played in Maxwell Street, Chicago. Since then they've played many gigs on the Gold Coast and Northern Rivers.





September Gig – Dezzie - D and the Stingrays

Dezzie-D bopped around as she sang for those who remember, or simply enjoy, the music from the 50's 60s and 70s. Their music was a mix of jazz tinged tunes like Fever, and others were a blend of Rock'n'Roll and Rhythm and Blues. The Peter Gunn Theme went down well with the raspy sound of Dan Ford's sax.






October Gig – Horn among the Roses
